Livestock husbandry has been a major component of Indian agricultural production systems since times immemorial. Animal Husbandry, Dairy and Fisheries sectors play a crucial part in the national economy. The contribution of these sectors to the GDP is about 5.26%. India houses the biggest number of livestock (281 million) in the world. India ranks 1st in respect of buffalo, 2nd in cattle and goats, 3rd in sheep, 4th in ducks, 5th in chicken in the world. India continues to be the largest producer of milk and the third largest egg producer in the world. Thus livestock herds are the spine of rural and agricultural economy. Livestock provides vital additional income for sustenance of poor in rural areas through gainful employment. According to latest NSSO estimate, employment in the sectors was 11.44 million as main and 11.01 million as subsidiary occupation. Out of the 22.45 million, 16.84 million are women, to whom earning from these livestock is empowering. Livestock render insurance cover for the poor during drought and famine. Rightly referred to as 'walking wealth', livestock are a strategic investment when money is available and a cash source in crunch times. With relatively low outlay and high liquidity, they figure high in the investment portfolio of the rural poor. Livestock provide cheap nutritional food and indispensable proteins to the millions of people.

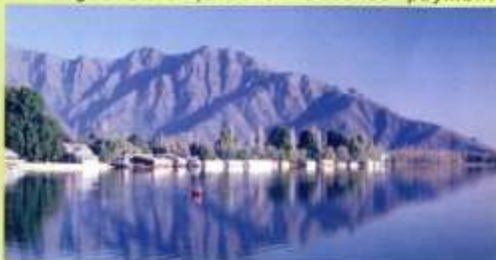
